The programme above for 1930 starred Dora Labette, who spent much of her childhood in Hastings. Mrs Labett lived at 17 Pelham Street. Dora's vocal talent was discovered by local composer Florence Aylward, who it is told, heard Dora singing as she passed by the window.

She became a protégée and mistress of Thomas Beecham and with him conspired to appear at the Royal Opera House as Lisa Perli. [she was born in Purley]. In 1933 there is a Miss Labbett listed at 20 St Helens Road. You can still hear her on You Tube.

Sadly Daphne Wilkinson [left] did not qualify for the final in the 1952 Helsinki Olympics but she is credited with breaking the record for 400 metres freestyle on the Leamington Spa website. She did gain a bronze medal in the 1954 British Empire and Commonwealth Games and has been inducted on the Coventry Hall of Fame.
